- Constituency or group you represent (for example: teacher, administrator, school board, school district, college, university, parent organization, community-based



- agency, etc.)
- Lessons learned, describing the interventions and strategies used
- A description of how your presentation will engage the audience
- Contact information on all presenters/panelists
